openness synonym candor: "openness of mind," c.1637, from Latin, "purity, openness," orig "whiteness," from candere "to shine"

Insight

insight c. 1200, insiht "sight with the eyes of the mind," mental vision, understanding, from in + sight. Sense shaded into "penetrating understanding into character or hidden nature" (c.1580). n. 1. the ability to perceive clearly or deeply; penetration. 2. a penetrating and often sudden understanding, as of a complex situation or problem 3. Psychol. The capacity for understanding one's own or another's mental processes. 4. Psychiatry. The ability to understand ones own problems.
